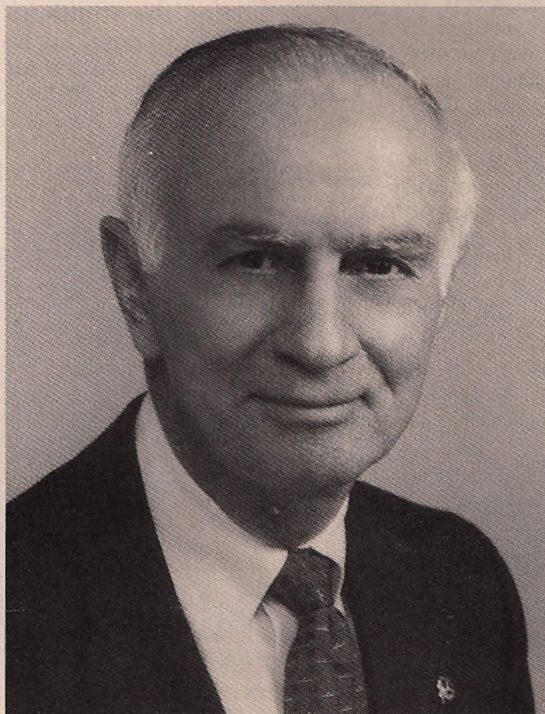


Officers and Directors
