Edwin R. Kingsley

Lionism has lost a great friend and outstanding leader. Edwin R. Kingsley, past international president, recently passed away after a brief illness. Lion Kingsley, a Key member and holder of a 30-year charter chevron in the Parkersburg, W. Va. club, was known and loved in all the states and nations of Lionism. His wise and efficient administration of Lions International as its president in 1936-37 marked the beginning of an era of progress which today has the Association in front of the service club field.

Born in Springfield, Ohio, he was educated in public schools and received his law degree from Adrian

College, Mich. Admitted to the bar in Ohio and West Virginia, he was also licensed to practice in Federal courts and served as attorney for the State Tax Commission of West Virginia. As a representative of Parkersburg in the Legislature, he headed the committee on counties, districts, and municipalities and was ranking member of the judiciary committee.

His rise up the ladder of Lionism was steady. From Parkersburg club presidency in 1923-24 he moved up to district governor in 1924-25, to international director for a two-year term in 1930, to third vice president in 1933, and in successive years to the presidency. He presided at the 20th anniversary convention in Chicago in 1937. During the past several years he has done outstanding service as a special representative of Lions International.
