
Past International President Joseph M. McLoughlin Passes Away



Past International President Joseph M. McLoughlin, of Stamford, Connecticut, passed away April 17, 1987, following a lengthy illness. He served as International President in 1977-78 and as International Director in 1970-72.

Past President McLoughlin was a member of the Springdale Lions Club in Stamford since 1956 and held every major office at the club and district levels. He also served as President of the Lions Clubs International Foundation in 1978-79 and 1979-80. At the time of his death, he was serving as an Appointee to the Convention Committee of the International Board of Directors.

Past President McLoughlin received a number of awards for his outstanding service on behalf of Lionism, including 16 International President's Awards, three Extension Awards, the Master Key, the Melvin Jones Fellow Award and the highest honor bestowed on a Lion, the Ambassador of Goodwill Award.

He was head of both a lumber company and a concrete block manufacturing plant.

Funeral services were held in Stamford on April 20 and the Association was officially represented by Past International President Joseph L. Wroblewski. Past International President McLoughlin is survived by his wife, Bette, son, Glenn and daughter, Kim.
