# Drug Awareness Program Honored

Lions commitment to drug abuse prevention and positive youth development has earned them the prestigious President's Citation Award for Private Sector Initiatives. Lions Clubs International received the honor from the White House Office of National Service for their support of Lions-Quest Skills for Adolescence.

International Director James S. Cameron accepted the award in Washington, D.C. on November 17, 1989. Lions Clubs International was one of 29 organizations selected from over 500 applicants.

The President's Citation Award is given each year to recognize the outstanding contributions made by the private sector in areas such as volunteerism, corporate social responsibility, publicprivate partnerships and philanthropy. Lions Clubs International was nominated by Quest International, the American Association of School Administrators and the National Association of Elementary School Principals.

## Free Loan Films Available To Clubs

If a club wishes to request as many as three tapes at one time, contact New Visions, stating the viewing date, a member's name, day telephone, UPS shipping address and P.O. Box, if applicable. Additionally, please estimate the viewing audience for each program. VHS copies are shipped so that they arrive one to two days in advance. When members are finished with the programs, New Visions asks that they fill out an enclosed affidavit telling how many people saw the program, and that they ship the tapes back within 10 days of the scheduled viewing date. If films are not returned within 30 days of the viewing date, New Visions reserves the right to charge \$25 per tape for replacement.
