

OHIO District 13

10 sub-Districts

- 1917 First Club Organized - Cleveland
- 1917 First Board of Directors on Oct. 8-10, 1917 parceled the country out into districts for the organization and administration of Lions Clubs, and appointed a District Governor over each one. The districts were numbered from the Pacific Coast eastward. At that time, Ohio, along with Nebraska, Iowa, Illinois, Indiana Michigan and Eastern Wisconsin were considered the 9th District.
- 1921 In 1921, after the Convention in Oakland, Cal., the whole country was redistricted and Ohio became District 13.
- 1933-1934 District 13 (Ohio) divides to form Multiple District 13 composed of sub-Districts 13-A and 13-B
- 1941-1942 Multiple District 13 divides to form 4 new sub-Districts to be known as sub-Districts 13-A,13-B,13-C and 13-D
- 1947-1948 Multiple District 13 divides from 4 sub-Districts to 6 sub-Districts to be known as sub-Districts 13-A,13-B,13-C,13-D,13-E,13-F
- 1948-1949 Multiple District 13 divides from 6 sub-Districts to 7 sub-Districts to be known as sub-Districts 13-A,13-B,13-C,13-D,13-E,13-F and 13-G
- 1950-1951 Multiple District 13 divides from 7 sub-Districts to 8 sub-Districts to be known as sub-Districts 13-A,13-B,13-C,13-D,13-E,13-F,13-G & 13-H
- 1957-1958 Sub-District 13-A is dividing to form 2 new sub-Districts to be known as sub-Districts 13-A1 and 13-A2.
- 1959-1960 Sub-District 13-F is dividing to form 2 new sub-Districts to be known as sub-Districts 13-F1 and 13-F2
- 1960-1961 Change in District designation numbers from 13-A1,A2,B,C,D,E,F1,F2, G and H to 13-A,B,C,D,E,F,G,H,I and J
- 1963-1964 Sub-District 13-I has changed their letter designation to 13-K
